FLOWERS ANYONE?

An article was shared with me from someone in the congregation who frequents a church when they are in Florida, and I was happy to put my own spin on it and just use some inserts from the article itself. The original article titled "Flowers Anyone?" Was written by Bob Kolterman.

Every Sunday there is a bright spot in our church. Can you guess what that is? Am I speaking of the smiling faces of the Greeters and Ushers welcoming you, the hymns, the sermon, the choir, the quiet time and prayer. Let's not forget the fellowship we find with one another after worship. But one thing always catches my eye and brings a smile to my face; it never asks for anything in return and provides its own ministry. Did you guess it? If you said *the altar flowers* you are correct. How do they get there every week? Who puts them there? Who pays for them? Where do they go once the service is over?

Sunday, December 22, 1940, the church accepted two beautiful ALTAR VASES as memorials which match our cross and candlesticks. It was said that they came to us as a splendid token, without solicitation, from a family that has always been interested in our dear church. They have been dedicated "To the glory of God, and in loving memory of all of Messiah Church who have departed this life in the Christian Faith."

Hometown Florists provides and delivers the flowers on a weekly basis week after week, rain or shine, cloudy or sunny, difficulties or not; they are always here providing a presence of hope and freshness. They are delivered every Saturday and then moved into the Sanctuary on Sunday by the Ushers and placed behind the altar. Think of how many hands have touched these flowers: the grower who grew them, the artisan who put the arrangements together, the driver who delivered them and then our Ushers who lovingly place them on the altar. Here they listen to the music, the prayers and the sermon; but their job is not done yet.

Every Sunday someone has the flowers in memory or in honor of a loved one placed on the altar. They may choose to take those flowers or leave for our volunteer flower delivery person to take to some who may need a visit. After Worship the flowers are put in a decorative can and taken to brighten someone's day.

Here is a cute story I'd like to share: Mike and I signed up for flowers one Sunday in honor of a friend who was in a nursing home recovering from a bad accident. We decided to take the flowers to her after church that day. Now you will see that the flowers' work was not

yet done. As we stood at the front desk asking for our friend's room number, the receptionist commented on how beautiful the flowers were and wished someone would bring her flowers. I looked at her and then looked at the flowers and pulled one out and said, 'guess what? This one has your name written on it, the smile on her face was worth the trip there! As we were walking down the hall a nurse stopped us and said: "Look how beautiful. Are those for me?" After looking at her nametag, I answered: "Actually, Nancy, I believe this one has your name on it," and proceeded to pull out another flower for her. And so it went several times more until we came upon a frail elderly lady sitting in a wheelchair in the hall. As we walked by she just stared at the flowers. I asked her what her name was; she did not answer. She finally looked up at me and said: "My husband used to buy me flowers." Not sure what to say, I asked her what his name was. With no reply, I asked: "Is his name Joe?" She quickly replied; "No, it was David." I then picked out a flower, handed it to her and simply said: "this is in *remembrance* of David."

The flower had done its job again as it placed a smile on the woman's face. Well, the flowers, minus several, finally made it to its destination where they brightened another room. As we walked down the hall to exit the nursing home after our visit, the same elderly frail women was in the same spot in her wheelchair; she had her eyes closed clutching her single flower, obviously lost in yesteryear. But the flower had done its job.

Those flowers had traveled so much and touched so many people that it was, in and of itself, a small miracle. All this because I signed up to have flowers on the altar.

Please sign up and brighten the church's altar and see if it takes you on a journey like we had, won't you?

Volunteer to deliver the Altar Flowers; you never know where the flowers will take you!

Children/Family - <u>The Bernstein Bears Say Their</u> <u>Prayers</u> - Brother Bear discovers that God answers every prayer-in his own way and time. Children will learn, along with Brother Bear, that praying isn't just for bedtime. Found in the Children's books (Bernstein Bears) section.

Adult - **For Such a Time as This - Gospels** - This devotional book has the Gospels theme. So, each Bible verse is from one of the four Gospels and these one page meditations work perfectly with the scripture verse(s). There is also a prayer at the end of each meditation.
