All of these are uses for quilts and blankets, but thankfully we are familiar with only one use. We put them on a bed, and change them with the seasons, or when we redecorate. Many people of the world are sadly acquainted with all the possible uses. Please check your closets and shelves for blankets that you do not use, or consider purchasing one for those that LWR seek to help.

### MISSIONAL OUTREACH COMMITTEE

There shall be a COMMITTEE ON MISSIONAL OUTREACH. This committee shall stimulate and lead all members of the congregation in continuous and, from time to time, concerted endeavors to reawaken the spiritually indifferent and to reach those unchurched with the Gospel, and bring them to Christ's church. To this end, the committee shall be involved in the **annual review of the membership roster**, devoting itself to deepening spiritual life and periodically study the congregation in the context of its surrounding community. The committee shall also **extend Christian compassion and helpfulness to the ill, the aged, the orphaned, the underprivileged, the imprisoned, and in general, to all <b>persons, of all ages, in need of aid for body or soul**. It shall strive to enlist, in these efforts, as many individual members and organizations, of the congregation, as possible. This committee shall further have the duty to study social conditions, primarily in the local community, in order to bring the cleansing and healing light of Christian truth upon critical problems, through thoughtful Christian discussions of facts and issues.

To fulfill this mission, we have a food pantry, sew dresses and britches for children in Africa, fill school kits and collects quilts and blanket for LWR, fill satchels for Seafarers, who work on carrier ships, give white gifts and food baskets at Christmas, and provide assistance to those who need help. All members of Messiah are called to join in these efforts.

### PROPERTY COMMITTEE

The Property Committee is responsible for the maintenance and care of all property of the congregation. The committee is responsible for keeping our facilities in good, general repair and ensures that fire safety codes are followed.

#### FELLOWSHIP COMMITTEE

There shall be a COMMITTEE ON FELLOWHIP to plan and administer events and programs to further a sense of unity in the congregation. This committee shall be responsible for the organization of the kitchen and provisions and supplies for the kitchen and related areas. The Fellowship Committee seeks to build our congregation's family atmosphere. The committee provides opportunities for all who are a part of our church family to experience social gatherings alongside the Worship Experience. Our goal is allowing everyone to share a meal or snack while enjoying one another's company. We arrange for volunteers for our coffee hours and picnic as well as provide the supplies needed.

#### WORSHIP AND MUSDIC

There shall be a COMMITTEE ON WORSHIP AND MUSIC, of which the organist/choir director shall be a member(s). It shall assist the congregation council in seeing that the services of God's house are conducted regularly and in accordance with the liturgy of the ELCA, that competent ushers, acolytes, greeters, banner bearers, lay assistants and crucifers are recruited and trained, and that hymnals and other devotional materials are provided and properly cared for. This committee shall supervise, and strive to advance the welfare and effective service of, the choirs and musicians of the congregation, the altar guild and making sure elements for Holy Communion are ordered/available. It shall arrange for the care of the altar, paraments, vestments, musical instruments and, in consultation with the pastor(s) and the organist/choir director, it shall furnish music supplies appropriate for use in the worship of a congregation of the ELCA.

This wraps up our Committee descriptions. I hope this will entice you to consider joining one of these committees. As you can see these committees help PEOPLE outside the community, but our PEOPLE inside the church also. All you have to do is be present and commit to one evening a month, that's it.
