

UTHERAN WORLD RELIEF SCHOOL KITS

It's that time of year again - time to kick off our annual LWR School Kits project!

The School Kits we make will be sent to children around the world who are in need due to poverty, natural disasters, conflict, or other issues that make it difficult to attend school. For many of these children, *these supplies mean the difference between getting an education or not.*

This is a 9-month project involving folks of all ages. Beginning in February, our volunteers shop for fabric and begin marking and cutting the pieces to make the backpacks. Throughout the Springtime, a dedicated group of women work diligently to sew the backpacks.

We then reach out to the local community by involving the children who attend Bible School to take part in the project. Bible School offerings are used to help purchase supplies for the packs, and children in grades 4-6 spend part of the morning helping to string the drawstring cords through the casings of the packs.

Over the summer, the congregation takes advantage of the back-to-school sales to shop for supplies. Then the children are invited back to attend the "Pack-a-Sack" event in September to see their efforts come to fruition as folks of all ages work together as a team to fill the packs. Once assembled, the school kits are packed into cartons and taken to the local LWR ingathering in October, from where they are then delivered to the LWR warehouse in Maryland for distribution to those in need around the world.

Last year, we were blessed to be able to complete 374 school kits, thanks to God's grace, and thanks to YOU. Whether you offered support by sewing, making donations, helping at Bible School, through prayer, or just cheering us on from the pews, God did His work through each of YOU. How will you hear and respond to God's call as we undertake this project again this year?
