Day of Pentecost Sunday, May 19

This Sunday we are celebrating Pentecost Day, the birthday of church, which is exactly fifty days after Easter. We ask that everyone wears red to celebrate.

Why Wear red on Pentecost Sunday?

This is a tradition that is rooted in Christian history and holds a profound meaning that reflects the very essence of our faith. Pentecost commemorates the Holy Spirit's descent upon the apostles and disciples of Jesus. This marks the inception of the Christian community and ignited the flames of faith across the world.


