Odds and Ends of Church Symbols



THE CELTIC CROSS

Sometimes called the Irish Cross, Cross of Iona, or Wheel Cross. It has a circle signifying eternity around the middle part of the cross. This type of cross is often seen on covers of hymnals and other publications, on tombstones in cemeteries, in church steeples, altars and church doors.

THE BUDDED CROSS


Also known as the Botonee Cross, is a very beautiful cross often used on top of the Christian flag, and may be of either Latin or Greek type, with trefoil ends.





An open book, often pictured on religious publications and

stained glass windows in our churches, refers to the Holy Bible, the Word of God. The opened book indicates that the Bible is accessible throughout most of the world. Translations of the Bible, or portions of it, have been published in more than a thousand tongues.



Also called the Creator's star or the symbol of creation, it doubly emphasizes the Holy Trinity in the process of creation. The six pointed star is also used by the Jews as the star of David and the symbol of Zionism.

THE ALPHA AND OMEGA stand for Jesus Christ, "the first and the last, the beginning and the end" (Reb 22:13) the same yesterday and today and forever.





IHS Another popular symbol is IHS. Six interpretations are given to the letters IHS; the first is the one preferred, since it is historically correct, but the others are not to be ignored. They have several centuries of tradition behind them. The first explanation is that the letters are formed from the Greek word (IHCOYC) for Jesus. As knowledge of Greek became rare, the Greek C was changed to a Latin S, so the abbreviation was often IHS instead of IHC.

CHI RHO The CHI ROH symbol, an ancient monogram of Christ. It often appears on altars, book marks and stoles. Where does it come from? What does it mean? The most usual form consists of the P within the X. The monogram has been in Christian use for at least 1600 years. Constantine the Great had the monogram of Christ placed on the shields of his soldiers. The symbol is derived from the first two letters of the Greek word XPICTOC (pronounced Christos). The letters abbreviate the name of Christ.


