Symbols in the Church - Mrs. Blair's Class on Symbols

Symbols on the Altar

Front of the Altar, top row, from left-right



THE PHOENIX (Newness of Life)

One of the most widely used of all symbols of our Lord's Resurrection is the phoenix. The legends concerning this fabled bird vary slightly. According to one version of the phoenix legend, this bird, which resembles an eagle somewhat, lives to the age of four to five hundred years. It gathers a

nest of sweet smelling twigs and spices. These are set on fire by the heat of the sun (a variation of the legend says by the fanning of the bird's wings), and she is consumed by the fire. Out of the ashes the bird rises again, recreated and young, destined to live another five hundred years.

The symbolism of the phoenix is two-fold. It may pertain to the resurrection of our Lord, or it may signify the fact that those who fall asleep in Christ shall rise again to newness of life. Without forcing a meaning into it, for the old Adam in us is drowned and destroyed with all the sin and evil lusts, and the new man comes forth, born again of water and of the spirit. (This is also on the back of the Altar also, third one in top row.)



THE AGNUS DEI (Lamb of God) and **BANNER OF VICTORY** The use of the Lamb of God is likewise of most ancient origin. It is based upon such Scripture verses St. John 1:29 The next day John saw Jesus coming unto him, and said, "Behold the Lamb of God, which taketh away the sin of the world."

Any form of art must be symbolic if it is to convey a spiritual message. A representation of the Lamb of God must tell the story of man's sin, and the sacrifice of the Lamb of Calvary, it is to be devotional.

Similar reference is made in the book of Revelation, and subsequently in the great hymns and prayers of the Church. Quite often the symbol of the Lamb is found in one form or another on communion ware and liturgical hangings.

Sometimes the Lamb carries a resurrection banner, or a white pennant with a red cross on a cruciform standard. The white pennant represents the body of Christ, which is attached to the cruciform staff, representing the cross on which the Lamb of God died and through which the risen Christ saves the world. When the Lamb is depicted as laying down, reference is made to a suffering and burden-bearing Christ, on whom the Lord laid "the iniquity of us all" (Isaiah 53:6) When the Lamb is standing, suggestion is given that the Lamb of God is triumphant, risen.



THE AGNUS DEI (Lamb of God) and **BOOK OF SEVEN SEALS** In ancient time examples the Agnus Dei may be seen laying upon the Book of Seven Seals or carrying the banner of Victory. It must be crowned with the three-rayed nimbus, signifying that is a symbol of divinity.

THE BUTTERFLY - This is one of the finest of all the symbols of the Resurrection, and of eternal life through Jesus Christ. With such splendid symbols as this available, why confine ourselves to two or three threadbare examples? The three stages in the life history of the butterfly represent three stages of the Christian. First is the crawling larva, representing the lowly condition of mortal man on this earth. Next is the chrysalis, lying in his

shell, and seemingly lifeless. This depicts the body of man in the grave. Finally, the pupa bursts its outer shell, emerges, dries it wings and soars heavenward with a beautiful new body. So also does our Lord Jesus raise up all the dead at the last day, and the soul and glorified body are reunited, to dwell in heaven forever. What finer symbol is there of the power of our Savior to raise up faithful believers?
