

White Gifts? What is That? 10 things everyone needs to know....

- 1. When can I take an angel off the tree? Any time from now until December 8.
- 2. When taking an angel, what should I do?
 Sign your name, phone # and the child's ID number on the sign-up sheet.
- 3. Why is there a letter and number on the wing?

 The letter identifies the family; the number identifies the child in that family. This is why it is very important to tape the angel on your package.
- **4. Do I have to buy the color that is their favorite?** No, this is offered as a suggestion.
- 5. Why do we only use white paper to wrap our gifts?

 The white paper is a reminder of the birth and white cloths that wrapped our Baby Jesus, God's son. Decorations and ribbon are not necessary. The gifts are placed in a large white bag for ease in moving. "Oh, don't forget to put the angel on securely."
- *6.* What is next? Please bring the wrapped gift, with the angel attached, to the church. In the Chapel, the pews will have letters on them. Place your gift in the pew with the matching letter.
- 7. Other ways to help?
 Often times we need to buy gifts the last week for angels that are not taken. We can really use some shoppers and wrappers. Also December 16th we will need help getting the gifts out to the cars of the families.
- 8. You can't get out to shop? That's ok.

 Not everyone is able to get out and shop; another way to help is with a monetary donation. Just make a check out to Messiah Lutheran Church and in the memo, write "white gifts".
- 9. How many gifts does each child get?
 On the form that the parents fill out the child can receive 6 items. Please be considerate of the other children in your family when buying your gifts. Some of you are very generous when buying and some buy just what is on the list.

10. Important Dates!!

- ❖ December 8th last day to take an angel.
- ❖ December 15th all gifts must be returned.
- ❖ December 21st parents pick up their gifts and baskets

Sometime **BEFORE** December 21st take a moment and look in the Chapel and see the pews filled with gifts and pause to offer a prayer of thanksgiving for the generous hearts responding to the call to reach out and serve. We are so blessed. Thank you.
