LENTEN DISCIPLINE BEGINS ASH WEDNESDAY, MARCH 5, 2025



The church's call to begin a Lenten pilgrimage begins with Ash Wednesday's forceful reminder that "you are dust and to dust you shall return." We are in fact dependent upon God, who calls us both to repentance and to His love. There will be a liturgy of Word and Sacrament at 7:00 PM, including the imposition of ashes.

The liturgy for Ash Wednesday states "...we are called to struggle against everything that leads us away from the love of God and neighbor. I invite you therefore to commit yourselves to this struggle."

Lenten Evening Vespers will begin on March 12 at 6:30 p.m. Janet Stroble, ALWL will lead the service followed by a brief bible study of scripture reflection with Carl Gee. Please make a commitment to join us for prayer and the study of Scripture Wednesday evenings this Lent. Over the course of five weeks we will take the journey along with Christ to the cross.

Kids in Mission: Lenten Bible School/Service Project Saturday, March 29, 9:00 am – 12:00pm. Adult and teen helpers will be needed. More details to come!
