

#### **MAUNDY THURSDAY**



This evening our Lenten observance comes to an end, and we gather with Christians around the world to celebrate the Three Days of Jesus' death and resurrection. Tonight we remember Christ's last meal with his disciples, but the central focus is his commandment that we live out the promise embodied in this meal. As Jesus washed his disciples' feet, so we are called to give and receive love in humble service to one another. Formed into a new body in Christ through this holy meal, we are transformed by the mercy we have received and carry it into the world. Departing worship in solemn silence, we anticipate the coming days.

#### **CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS**

P: Friends in Christ, in this Lenten season we have heard our Lord's call to struggle against sin, death, and the devil—all that keeps us from loving God and each other. This is the struggle to which we were called at baptism.

Within the community of the church, God never wearies of forgiving sin and offering his reconciliation. On this night let us confess our sin against God and our neighbor, and enter the celebration of the great Three Days reconciled with God and with one another.

Kneel

**P**: Most merciful God,

**C**: we confess that we are captive to sin and cannot free ourselves.

We have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. For the sake of your Son, Jesus Christ,

have mercy on us.
Forgive us, renew us, and lead us,
so that we may delight in your will

and walk in your ways, to the glory of your holy name. Amen

P: God, who is rich in mercy, loved us even when we were dead in sin, and made us alive together with Christ. By grace you have been saved.

In the name of + Jesus Christ, your sins are forgiven.

# FIRST READING: Exodus 12:1-4, 11-14

A: A reading from Exodus:

<sup>1</sup>The LORD said to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt: <sup>2</sup>This month shall mark for you the beginning of months; it shall be the first month of the year for you. <sup>3</sup>Tell the whole congregation of Israel that on the tenth of this month they are to take a lamb for each family, a lamb for each household. <sup>4</sup>If a household is too small for a whole lamb, it shall join its closest neighbor in obtaining one; the lamb shall be divided in proportion to the number of people who eat of it.

<sup>11</sup>This is how you shall eat it: your loins girded, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand; and you shall eat it hurriedly.

It is the Passover of the LORD. <sup>12</sup>For I will pass through the land of Egypt that night, and I will strike down every firstborn in the land of Egypt, both human beings and animals; on all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgments: I am the LORD. <sup>13</sup>The blood shall be a sign for you on the houses where you live: when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and no plague shall destroy you when I strike the land of Egypt.

<sup>14</sup>This day shall be a day of remembrance for you. You shall celebrate it as a festival to the LORD; throughout your generations you shall observe it as a perpetual ordinance.

**A**: The Word of the Lord.

**C**: Thanks be to God.

#### SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 11:23-26

**A**: A Reading from First Corinthians:

<sup>23</sup>For I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took a loaf of bread, <sup>24</sup>and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." <sup>25</sup>In the same way he took the cup also, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." <sup>26</sup>For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.



# **GOSPEL ACCLAMATION**





GOSPEL: John 13:1-17, 31b-35

**P**: The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the thirteenth chapter.

C: Glory to you, O Lord.

<sup>1</sup>Now before the festival of the Passover, Jesus knew that his hour had come to depart from this world and go to the Father. Having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end. <sup>2</sup>The devil had already put it into the heart of Judas son of Simon Iscariot to betray him. And during supper <sup>3</sup> Jesus, knowing that the Father had given all things into his hands, and that he had come from God and was going to God, <sup>4</sup>got up from the table, took off his outer robe, and tied a towel around himself. 5Then he poured water into a basin and began to wash the disciples' feet and to wipe them with the towel that was tied around him. <sup>6</sup>He came to Simon Peter, who said to him, "Lord, are you going to wash my feet?" 7Jesus answered, "You do not know now what I am doing, but later you will understand." 8Peter said to him, "You will never wash my feet." Jesus answered, "Unless I wash you, you have no share with me." 9Simon Peter said to him, "Lord, not my feet only but also my hands and my head!" 10 Jesus said to him, "One who has bathed does not need to wash, except for the feet, but is entirely clean. And you are clean, though not all of you." 11For he knew who was to betray him; for this reason he said, "Not all of you are clean."

<sup>12</sup>After he had washed their feet, had put on his robe, and had returned to the table, he said to them, "Do you know what I have done to you? <sup>13</sup>You call me Teacher and Lord—and you are right, for that is what I am. <sup>14</sup>So if I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. <sup>15</sup>For I have set you an example, that you also should do as I have done to you. <sup>16</sup>Very truly, I tell you, servants are not greater than their master, nor are messengers greater than the one who sent them. <sup>17</sup>If you know these things; you are blessed if you do them."

<sup>31b</sup>"Now the Son of Man has been glorified, and God has been glorified in him. <sup>32</sup>If God has been glorified in him, God will also glorify him in himself and will glorify him at once. <sup>33</sup>Little children, I am with you only a little longer. You will look for me; and as I said to the Jews so now I say to you, 'Where I am going, you cannot come.' <sup>34</sup>I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. <sup>35</sup>By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."







#### **EUCHARISTIC PRAYER**

**P**: We give you thanks, Father, through Jesus Christ, your beloved Son, whom you sent in this end of the ages to save and redeem us and to proclaim to us your will. He is your Word, inseparable from you. Through him you created all things, and in him you take delight. He is your Word, sent from heaven to a virgin's womb. He there took on our nature and our lot and was shown forth as your Son, born of the Holy Spirit and of the virgin Mary. It is he, our Lord Jesus, who fulfilled all your will and won for you a holy people; he stretched out his hands in suffering in order to free from suffering those who trust you. It is he who, handed over to a death he freely accepted. in order to destroy death, to break the bonds of the evil one, to crush hell underfoot, to give light to the righteous, to establish his covenant, and to show forth the resurrection, taking bread and giving thanks to you, said: Take and eat; this is my body, broken for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.

In the same way he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying:
This is my blood poured out for you.
Do this for the remembrance of me.

Remembering, then, his death and resurrection, we lift this bread and cup before you, giving you thanks that you have made us worthy to stand before you and to serve you as your priestly people. And we ask you:

Send your Spirit upon these gifts of your Church; gather into one all who share this bread and wine; fill us with your Holy Spirit to establish our faith in truth, that we may praise and glorify you through your Son Jesus Christ. Through him all glory and honor are yours, Almighty Father, with the Holy Spirit, in your holy Church both now and forever.


#### LORD'S PRAYER

## THE STRIPPING OF THE ALTAR

#### PSALM 22

Pulpit side of the congregation read verses 1-10

- <sup>1</sup>My God, my God, why have you forsaken me and are so far from my cry, and from the words of my distress?
- <sup>2</sup>O my God, I cry in the daytime, but you do not answer; by night as well, but I find no rest.
- <sup>3</sup>Yet you are the Holy One, enthroned upon the praises of Israel.
- enthroned upon the praises of Israel. 4Our forefathers put their trust in you;
- they trusted, and you delivered them.

  They cried out to you and were delivered; they trusted in you and were not put to shame.
- <sup>6</sup>But as for me, I am a worm and no man, scorned by all and despised by the people.
- <sup>7</sup>All who see me laugh me to scorn; they curl their lips and wag their heads, saying,
- 8"He trusted in the LORD; let him deliver him; let him rescue him, if he delights in him."
- <sup>9</sup>Yet you are he who took me out of the womb, and kept me safe upon my mother's breast.
- <sup>10</sup>I have been entrusted to you ever since I was born; you were my God when I was still in my mother's womb.

Lectern side of the congregation read verses 11-25

- <sup>11</sup>Be not far from me, for trouble is near, and there is none to help.
- <sup>14</sup>I am poured out like water; all my bones are out of joint; my heart within my breast is melting wax.
- <sup>15</sup>My mouth is dried out like a pot-sherd; my tongue sticks to the roof of my mouth; and you have laid me in the dust of the grave.
- <sup>16</sup>Packs of dogs close me in, and gangs of evildoers circle around me; they pierce my hands and my feet, I can count all my bones.
- <sup>17</sup>They stare and gloat over me; they divide my garments among them; they cast lots for my clothing.
- <sup>18</sup>Be not far away, O LORD; you are my strength; hasten to help me..
- <sup>21</sup>I will declare your name to my brethren; in the midst of the congregation I will praise you.
- <sup>22</sup>Praise the LORD, you that fear him; stand in awe of him, O offspring of Israel; all you of Jacob's line, give glory.
- <sup>23</sup>For he does not despise nor abhor the poor in their poverty; neither does he hide his face from them; but when they cry to him he hears them.
- <sup>24</sup>My praise is of him in the great assembly; I will perform my vows in the presence of those who worship him.
- <sup>25</sup>The poor shall eat and be satisfied, and those who seek the LORD shall praise him:
  - "May your heart live forever!"

All read verses 26-30

- <sup>26</sup>All the ends of the earth shall remember and turn to the LORD, and all the families of the nations shall bow before him.
- <sup>27</sup>For kingship belongs to the LORD; he rules over the nations.
- <sup>28</sup>To him alone all who sleep in the earth bow down in worship; all who go down to the dust fall before him.
- <sup>29</sup>My soul shall live for him; my descendants shall serve him; they shall be known as the LORD's forever.
- <sup>30</sup>They shall come and make known to a people yet unborn the saving deeds that he has done.
