

Summertime Slumber

"When the Lord your God brings you into the land he swore to your fathers, to Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, to give you—a land with large, flourishing cities you did not build, houses filled with all kinds of good things you did not provide, wells you did not dig, and vineyards and olive groves you did not plant—then when you eat and are satisfied, be careful that you do not forget the Lord, who brought you out of Egypt, out of the land of slavery. Fear the Lord your God, serve him only and take your oaths in his name."

I love summer! It feels like an extended Sabbath — a time to step back from the business and take time to rest. But there's a problem: I've found that more fun, more adventures, and more leisure doesn't always lead to more prayer. I can get caught up in the summer moments and forget about God. My favorite time of year can lull me into a spiritual slumber.

On a walk through our neighborhood's green space, I noticed an invasive species growing beside the path. The Giant Hogweed, already about three feet tall, looked innocent enough, but its poisonous sap can cause burns that leave scarring for years. An unaware child or jogger could easily brush up against it and suffer terribly.

The season of summer fun and recreation is not without its dangers. It can be fertile soil for certain vices that poison our relationship with God: neglect of prayer, an attitude of self-sufficiency, worshiping recreation instead of the Creator. If allowed to grow, these vices will lead to spiritual apathy.

It's OK to enjoy the extra leisure this summer, but remember to pray, turning each enjoyable moment into worship. How do we do that? It's simple; when something brings a smile to our face we just pray, "God, thank you so much for this!" Let's keep Jesus the center this summer and "serve him only" even when life feels good and carefree (Deuteronomy 6:13). Then this summer truly will be full of pleasure, the way God intended it.

Father, thank You for creating a wonderful world for us to enjoy this summer season. Please help me keep You at the center of all of my activities through offering thanksgiving. Amen.

Go Deeper — Bring God into the center of your recreation. Before and after your next fun activity, offer up thanks to God. Also, ask Him to help you connect with someone with whom you could start to model Christ and share Him.

Children's book - <u>Grandpa is there a Heaven?</u> - When children ask questions about this sensitive subject, pull them onto your lap and read them this gentle book. Full of important questions and answers, this book explains the compassion and beauty of God's plan for His people through Jesus, and how the Bible tells us it's true. Jesus is real. He's alive today. He's preparing a place for His people. And it's called heaven. This book is found in the children's section of the library.

With questions like these, you want to be certain the answers are correct. This book contains a bunch of questions and answers; it has its limits--there are a lot of questions that don't get answered here. WOWZA! We have enough supplies to fill 380 backpacks at this time ... well, *almost!* We are short on pencils and scissors to fill that number, but we do have the cash to purchase those.

Nothing about this project is a perfect science and the only predictable thing about it is that it is unpredictable! It's always a judgement call on our part

on when/how to spend the money ... What supplies will come in? How long will the current sale prices last? What might go on sale next? So we spend the cash donations very judiciously.

Especially needed at this time: **safety scissors, UN-sharpened pencils** are needed to even out the piles. We also still need **black or blue stick pens** and <u>70-page spiral notebooks</u>. (Staples, WalMart, & Target all have these for the same price at this time – we love options!) Crayons are still needed but we are a bit ahead on those, so not as many are needed.

Please note: We have almost enough erasers to fill 800 packs. If you already purchased erasers, please **do** bring them in, but there is no need to purchase more at this time.
