CALL COMMITTEE UPDATE

In answer to the question that has been recently asked of me, the Call Committee is still intact. We knew when we started the endeavor to call a new pastor that it may take some time. Since the formation of the Call Committee, the number of available pastors has decreased even more.

Recently, statistics have been presented to the congregation on the situation outlining the current pastor availability. To reiterate those statistics, the fact is that over half of the current pastors are retired and the graduating class of seminary students is very low. There are many congregations currently without a called pastor.

The Synod is working through this shortfall as best as they can but there is no "quick fix". Unfortunately, the Upper Susquehanna Synod is not the only Synod experiencing this situation. It is nationwide and is not only impacting the Lutheran denomination but the churches with whom we are in a full communion partnership.

We ask that you remain patient as we continue to work through the issues. Please continue to keep all of God's churches in your prayers.

Children/families/adults/teachers - Have you ever wondered how to explain to children about the church year? What does each season mean and information about each of those seasons of the church year? Well, there is a great book called **THE TIME OF THE CHURCH.** There is a reading book as well as an activity book (which can be copied) to help children understand the church year with a variety of puzzles, games, coloring sheets, prayers, etc. Both books are found in Teacher Helps section of our library.

are especially needed ... wearing shoes enables a child to attend school in a Third World country.




