## Lutheran World Relief School Kits – If You Sew Them, They Will Be Filled!

We've said it before, but — *Wow!* Did we *ever* learn a lesson this year about not putting God in a box! When we started out at the beginning of Summer and stood up front and told you how many backpacks had been sewn and said, "Let's see where the Spirit leads," did we think that we would fill them all? *Nooope*.

Did we think that we would **not** fill them all? Also no! Because we've learned over the years that the Messiah family **is truly** a Spirit-led church – and we've seen what the Spirit can do. The two of us have experienced first-hand what

your love and generosity can do, how everyone pulls together for the common good, each bringing their own gifts to the table, and amazing – sometimes even *seemingly unbelievable* – things happen. *If it is God's will, He will provide a way.* 

From beginning to end, we have been amazed. Our ladies who sewed, along with the help of the Bible School kids and our knotters, ended up completing a grand total of **824** backpacks this year. Then they needed to be filled ... and the donations started pouring in.

First, the notebooks came - 3,304 notebooks to be exact. And then the shoppers came, and monetary donations, and all of the other supplies – so many, in fact, that we have a surplus of items for next year. We even received a surprise donation – 100% free, including delivery – of 2 very large bolts of fabric which we estimate will get us through the next two years!

Then the question became, "How will we do the work to actually put together that many school kits?" Again, the Spirit did not disappoint. Many of our Bible School children and their families came to join with many of you from our own Messiah family to tackle the task. Shaheen Hall was packed last Saturday night with quite a jolly crew to fill the backpacks, inspect them, and pack them into cartons.

All said and done, we filled *all 824* backpacks that were sewn *plus one more*. When we initially counted the crayons, there were 825 boxes. Kathy couldn't bear to not use up that last box, so Sally obliged and sewed another backpack.

The Spirit called ... and **825** *children* will be able to attend school because *you answered* the call. Each child who is blessed to receive an education as a result of your help will have a chance to go on and be a blessing to others. Who knows what gifts they will bring to the world?

We cannot say it enough ... thank you, thank you for the incredible outpouring of support. The two of us were left speechless on more than one occasion as this project came to fruition. You have shown us without a doubt what it means to be "blessed to be a blessing." This is what family does! ~ With grateful and humbled hearts, Sal and Kath

Harvest Home and Blanket Sunday is Sunday, October 5, 2025. Worshippers will be invited to bring forward their gifts of canned goods, boxes of pasta, or monetary offerings for the hungry during the singing of the Hymn of Praise.

Donations of fresh produce (pumpkins, potatoes, apples, squash, etc.),

cornstalks and gourds to use in decorating <u>are very much needed</u>. All perishable items may be dropped off at the church office any time Thursday-Friday, October 2-3, or you may bring the day of the set-up on Saturday, October 4. Where does the food go? All perishable gifts of food received will be shared with the United Churches Food Pantry and the canned goods will stock our own food pantry and help to supply the Christmas baskets. #### MISSION TO SEAFARERS



Did you realize that **90%** of **everything we wear, use, and consume,** come to us by merchant ships, operated by 1.5 million seafarers? On ships for 9 to 10 months at a time, the seafarers face many hardships: storms, piracy, abandonment, and loss of contact with their families. Often the only contact they have beyond the ship, the Chaplains provide emotional and spiritual support.
