This Sunday, October 26 is Reformation Sunday



On October 31, 1517, Martin Luther, a German monk and University Professor, issued a challenge to debate any fellow professor regarding 95 points of concern about the teachings of mother church. As was the custom, this challenge was posted on the door of the University Church. This challenge was discovered by someone who was at the cutting edge of technology, a printer, and these 95 Theses for debate were circulated to the general public.

Under the leadership from Rome the church had developed into a huge power, a combination of religion and politics with the church holding the ace card, the keys to heaven.

It was this power that Martin Luther faced when he nailed his 95 Theses to the door in Wittenberg in October of 1517. The Reformation was launched.

Over 500 years later on this October 31 we celebrate the story of the Reformation and the roots of the Lutheran tradition. We remember Martin Luther and the other men and women who boldly proclaimed the good news of God's grace. And we remember the gift that they gave us: not a denomination or even a congregation, but the insistence that God's amazing love is given to us freely. Every time we proclaim that God's love is more powerful than our sin and shortcomings, we honor them.

Please wear red to commemorate the occasion.



Donations of the following items are needed:

- Canned corn

- Canned gravy or gravy packets
- Stove Top stuffing
