Youth - Caution: Dangerous Devotions - an exciting journey through the New Testament - This book will take you where you've never gone before. Proceed, if you dare. The trip may get dangerous! You could be challenged to learn something about yourself and God's Word. Expect the unexpected. This book will make you stop and

think, but beware, the trip will be fun and exciting. As you hike through the New Testament, you'll gain a whole new perspective of God's Word and how it speaks to every area in your life. You will see how God put each book in its place to give you direction for your life. This book is in the Youth themed section of our library.

Adult - <u>Image and Spirit - Finding meaning in Visual Art</u> - provides a theological and aesthetic background for a view of art as visible Word - as embodiment of the transcendent. Geared to the non-specialist, the book develops the reader's ability to interpret and appreciate artworks, of any style and from any period, from a spiritual perspective. In addition, it explores the communal aspect of art, as a prophetic Word that challenges, mobilizes and sensitizes the Christian community; and as a pastoral Word that enriches the spiritual and aesthetic journey of a community of faith. White Gifts Ministry



Here's how it works: The angel tags on the trees list gift wishes/suggestions requested by each child. If you wish to purchase a gift, take a tag from the tree and purchase the gift noted on the tag. *Wrap it in plain white paper* and securely attach the angel tag to the gift. It is also helpful to write the number/letter code of the tag on the gift so that we can get it to the right child in the event the tag should inadvertently come off. Bring the wrapped gift in and place it in the blue bin in

the Chapel alcove. Please do <u>not</u> put gifts in the Chapel. Volunteers will sort the gifts. <u>All gifts</u> are due no later than Sunday, December 14 so that we can prepare them for distribution the following Saturday.

Something a little different this year ~ A Baby Sprinkle! So ... what is a baby sprinkle? A "sprinkle" is like a baby shower but on a smaller scale. This year we happen to have two newborns on our list of recipients. To be more accurate, one newborn and one baby yet to be born! The parents have chosen to be surprised, so we do not yet know if the baby will be a boy or a girl. Tags for this child are on the main tree and the other was "adopted" by one of our members, but the families will need some extra supplies for the babies. Having a "sprinkle" we will enable us to collect some additional essential items for each of the infants.

Look for a mini tree with tags listing these items. The items for the sprinkle are to be brought in **unwrapped** and placed in the basket in the narthex. We will then divide them between the two families who need these items for their newborns.

Cash donations are cheerfully accepted! Don't like to shop, or unsure exactly what to get? We'll do the shopping for you! Monetary donations can be sealed in an envelope marked "White Gifts" and placed in the offering plate during worship, or you may send them to the church office. Checks are to be made out to Messiah Lutheran Church with "White Gifts" written in the memo line. All cash donations are needed by December 14.

Did you know ... If you are a Thrivent member and wish to donate your **Thrivent Dollars**, they may be designated to both the White Gifts Ministry and the Christmas Food Baskets (or to either one) if you so choose.

Christmas Food Baskets: Our holiday ministry to fill the baskets we give to families in need at Christmas time is now officially under way!

Christmas Basket recipients are now being identified. If you know someone who could benefit from receiving a Christmas basket, *please contact the church office by*

Friday, December 5. The baskets will be ready for pick-up Saturday, December 20.

Donations of the following items are needed to fill the baskets: canned corn; canned green beans; canned yams; cranberry sauce; canned fruit (applesauce, peaches, pears, fruit cocktail); pie crust mix; canned pumpkin; evaporated milk; canned gravy or gravy packets; stove top stuffing; dessert mixes (cake, brownies, jello, pudding, etc.); cash donations.

Food items may be placed in the bin in the narthex on Sunday mornings or in the specially marked bin in the elevator alcove during the week.

Monetary gifts are also needed for the purchase of perishable items. Please place your gifts in an envelope marked "Christmas Baskets" and place it in the offering plate during worship or mail to the church office. Checks are to be made out to Messiah Lutheran Church with "Christmas Baskets" written in the memo line.

All donations are due no later than Sunday, December 14.
