As we wait for the arrival of Our Savior, here is a guest post from Rev. Jon D. Vieker, one of the three general editors of the *Lutheran Service Book: Companion to the Hymns*, which originally appeared in the December 2019 edition of *The Lutheran Witness*.

It starts the day after Halloween and in some places, even earlier. I am talking about the Christmas songs that permeate our commercial soundscape this time of year. From shopping malls to big box stores, from smartphones to gas pumps, the signature sound of Christmas is song.

And it's no wonder. Two millennia ago, Christmas itself began with song. The angel's announcement to the shepherds was followed by the first Christmas hymn: "Glory to God in the Highest, and on earth peace among those with whom He is pleased!" (Luke 2:14). The church hasn't stopped singing since, and even the world finds itself singing along.

The songs of Christmas are all around us. They carry God's Word into our ears, and so into our hearts. Take time this Christmas season to meditate on the words of these great "psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God" (Colossians 3:16). For therein dwells Christ, richly, for you.



For all the saints who can join us in singing praise to God: The next Saints in Song Sunday will be the fourth Sunday in Advent, December 21. The anthem is easy to learn. Rehearsal will be after Church on Sunday, December 14 and again on December 21 before worship at 8:45. If you like to sing, we hope you will join us.
